<b>MSc</b>	1.4.5	Proof of Academic Capabilities GMAT/GRE requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- The requirement for Proof of Academic Capabilities is set first, followed by the GMAT/GRE test as an alternative</li> <li>- For all MSc programmes, the minimum GMAT score is streamlined at 550.</li> <li>- In the streamlining, the GMAT is now applicable to MSc FE and MSc LDO as well.</li> <li>- The option to follow four SBE BSc courses to receive an exemption from the GMAT has been removed for all MSc programmes.</li> </ul>
<b>MSc</b>	1.4.7	Admission requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- For each programme, the option to be admitted with a University of Applied Sciences Bachelor's diploma or with a Master's diploma have been added. This was previously not included in the EER.</li> <li>- For MSc LDO the SBE BSc programmes have been added which provide direct admission into the Master's study programme, including BSc BA and BSc BE.</li> </ul>

<b>MSc</b>	3.1	Learning Goals	The learning goals of the Research Master's study programmes have been included as these differ slightly from the learning goals of the Master's study programmes.

<b>MSc</b>	6.1	Exemption two specialisations MSc IB	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- In MSc IB there are three different course codes for Data Analytics (EBC4263, EBC4264 and EBC4265). For students following two specialisations within MSc IB with each a different course code for Data Analytics, the regulation is added that they are exempt from the Data Analytics course of their second specialisation. The same is also added for the Master's thesis writing skills.</li> <li>- The paragraph on the exemption for the Double Degree and the Research Masters has been split to two paragraphs to clarify the regulations more.</li> </ul>
<b>MSc</b>	7.2 (new)	Extracurricular honours programme for MSc SSPS students	The students of MSc SSPS who started in AY21-22 have received the opportunity to participate in an extracurricular honours programme consisting of the MSc SUBLIM courses offered by SBE. The students will follow the extracurricular honours programme in AY22-23. Therefore, this has been included in the MSc EER, to be removed again with transitional regulations in AY23-24.
<b>MSc</b>	8.2	Measures/sanctions in case of Fraud	Added that, contrary to the UM Regulation for Fraud and Irregularities, the SBE BoE will impose sanctions to all students involved in a group assignment, even if only one of the students committed fraud. BoE has changed the order of the wording of this article slightly.
<b>MSc</b>	Chapter 10	Master's thesis	The Master's Thesis Code of Practice has been adjusted to the Master's Thesis Code of Practice <b>2022-2023</b> , as this will be updated before the next academic year, and the new Master's Thesis Code of Practice 2022-2023 will apply. This document will pass the decision bodies when it is ready.
<b>MSc</b>	10.2 par 5	Resit MSc Thesis	Paragraph 5 of Article 10.2 the resit period has been adjusted to "the number of months as included in the Master's Thesis Code of Practice 2022-2023" to remain flexible with regards to the Thesis process revision. <b>MSc</b>	10.8	Personal Circumstances and the Master's thesis deadline	Students who face personal circumstances will first participate in the resit period of the Master's thesis before a postponement of the deadline is given. The title and content of this article (based on an "extension") is therefore misleading. Therefore, the article has been extended, including the effect of participating in the resit period of the Master's thesis based on personal circumstances on a possible (Summa) Cum Laude.
<b>MSc</b>	12.5	(Summa) Cum Laude	For some DD programmes, on the SBE transcript there are numeric grades for only 43.0 ECTS credits as 13.0 ECTS credits are listed as pass/fail and 4.0 ECTS credits for the Thesis writing skill are listed as a pass/fail. The minimum of 47.0 ECTS credits to determine the (Summa) Cum Laude is therefore not possible. Therefore, the article is adjusted to base the (Summa) Cum Laude on all remaining numeric grades besides the passes.
<b>MSc</b>	13.2	Subjects of Appeal	Removed the double mentioning of decisions made by the BoE.
<b>MSc</b>	14.3 – 14.16	Master's exam in the specific programmes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- For each programme the learning goals have been included.</li> <li>- For several programmes the content has been updated or more clearly worded, these are not changes in content.</li> <li>- The Master's exam of the MSc SSPS has been added.</li> </ul>
