





2-year Double Degree Master's programme

This is a joint two-year programme in Sustainable and Applied Economics at graduate (master's) level. You will first spend one year at SBE and then transfer to the Université Catholique de Louvain (UCLouvain) for another academic year. The language of education is English. During the first year, you pay tuition fees at SBE. During the second year, you pay tuition fees at UCLouvain.
