Note: The United Kingdom (England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland) left the European Union on 31 January 2020. This was followed by a transition period up to and including 31 December 2020. The Withdrawal Agreement states that students who hold the British nationality and were already living in the Netherlands with a BRP-registration before 1 January 2021, are allowed to continue paying the statutory tuition fees as long as they continue to live in the Netherlands with that BRP-registration. British nationals who were already living in the Netherlands before 1 January 2021 and are only starting their studies after 31 December 2020 are also eligible for the statutory tuition fees, provided they have not completed a bachelor's or master's degree in the Netherlands already. To be equally eligible for the statutory tuition fee beyond 1 September 2021, these students also need to submit a copy of their residence permit according to the Withdrawal Agreement. They should send a copy of the front and back of that card to visa@maastrichtuniversity.nl and mention their student ID-number.

British nationals who moved to the Netherlands to study (and reside) after 1 January 2021, are designated as non-EU/EEA nationals. These students require a general residence permit
