- You are enthusiastic and have a proactive work attitude and are motivated

Terms of employment

- Temporary employment for 1 season; the temporary contract can be extended when performance is satisfactory.
- The period in which you will work runs from 1 September – 1 July (excluding pre-set fixed and bank holidays). In this period you will work two clusters of a 14 week course at 3 different levels (3 hours per week)
- The vacancy concerns a job position within scale 7 (Sports Instructor 4, €2.471-€3.336 on fulltime basis) or scale 8 (Sports Instructor 3, €2.818-€3.764 on fulltime basis) in accordance with the Collective Labor Agreement (CLA) of the VSNU (Association of universities in the Netherlands).
