Important deadlines for application

Applicable when starting on 1 September 2023

When you want to apply or are applying for this study programme, it is important that you inform yourself of the deadlines that you need to meet. The important deadlines when applying for this study programme are provided in the table below.

Note: if you are viewing this webpage on your phone, we recommend that you use portrait mode.

1 October 2022	Studielink is open for applications for the academic year 2023-2024
Up to and including 1 May 2023, 23:59 CET	Deadline for completing the entire application process for non-EU/EEA applicants (these applicants require a visa or residence permit)
Up to and including 1 June 2023, 23:59 CET	Deadline for completing the entire application process for EU/EEA applicants

Academic background

In order to apply for the master's programme Sustainability Science, Policy and Society you need to fulfill various admission requirements. One of the main requirements refers to your academic background. In order to be admitted to the master's programme you need to have a bachelor degree that is equivalent to a Dutch university bachelor. The Board of Admissions will determine the equivalence of your degree*. Applicants with a degree equivalent to a Dutch Applied Sciences bachelor degree will receive instructions from the Board of Admissions on how to compensate for this deficiency.

* To assess if the Bachelor's or Master's degree of the student is equivalent to a Dutch University Bachelor's or Master's degree, the Nuffic comparison tool for education systems on www.nuffic.nl will be used. If the Bachelor's or Master's degree is not included in these education systems, Nuffic will assess the degree separately. The verdict of Nuffic is final.

Documents required for application process

During the application process for this study programme you will need to complete a number of tasks for which you will often have to upload documents. The list below gives you an insight into what documents you will (and might) need to prepare .

Required documents for all applicants to this study programme

- A recent passport picture
The passport picture must satisfy [certain requirements](#).
- A copy of your valid passport or your EU/EEA identity card*
Make a copy of the page with your personal details. Save this copy as 'passport copy' and not as 'passport picture'.
- A certified copy of your transcript of records
- Bachelor or master degree equivalent to a Dutch University degree
- Curriculum vitae

- Proof of academic capabilities
 - Proof of having written a Bachelor's thesis of a minimum of 8.0 ECTS credits or an equivalent research paper on Dutch University level or;
 - Provide a minimum GMAT test score of 550, including a minimal Analytical Writing Assessment (AWA) score of 4.0 or;
 - If it is not possible to submit a proof of academic capabilities as listed above, the Board of Admissions will determine how you may compensate for this deficiency.
- Write a convincing letter of motivation in which you discuss the following. This letter will be carefully assessed by the Board of Admissions. Please make sure that you discuss the following in your letter:
 - Why specifically this master's programme? Please elaborate how it builds upon your previously gained knowledge and/or experience concerning sustainable development. (max. 300 words)
 - What do you expect to gain from completing this master's programme (max. 300 words)

Documents that might be required depending on your (academic) background

- Language proficiency in English

General background

Over the years, we have learned that there are a few factors that are important in determining whether a student is able to successfully complete the master's programme:

- English language skills
- Basic proficiency in research skills (from your previous education)
- High motivation and full-time dedication to the programme

Handling fee

Applicants who received their previous education in a non-EU/EEA country (handling fee)

How do we assess your application?

When you want to apply or are applying to this study programme, it is useful to know how we assess your application. You can find more information about this here.

The admissions decision is based on your whole application file. Selection will take place on the basis of your quality and suitability. In this respect your motivation, prior qualifications as well as your professional experience are important. The English language requirements and the requirement that you need to have a bachelor's degree at the start of the programme in September (regardless of relevance) are strictly applied.

No one will be admitted to this programme directly. In some cases, the Board of Admission may request additional documents or an interview. The decision will always be made on a case-by-case basis to determine whether there are sufficient grounds for admission.

You will receive the decision on your admissibility within 4 weeks after your application has been submitted to the Board of Admissions.

Note: only complete applications will be assessed. We therefore recommend that you adhere to the deadlines provided in the table under 'Important deadlines for application to this study programme' on this page.
