
NEW COLLEAGUES

Launched amidst a symposium in Amsterdam on January 16th, the manual boasts contributions from esteemed experts. Prof. **Dr. Manuela Joore** (KEMTA), a committee member, alongside the noteworthy input from **Prof. Dr. Silvia Evers** and **Dr. Ruben Drost** (both HSR), ensures a comprehensive and well-rounded resource for HTA methodology and unit prices. NEW GRANT - SECTORPLAN PREVENTION

Dr. Sabine Grimm was among the lucky ones to receive 0.5 FTE from the Sectorplan Prevention to do research on innovative health technology assessment (HTA) methods in the context of prevention. Sabine's idea is that a shift to a preventive, personalized and participatory healthcare system that has the aim of keeping healthcare sustainable and equitable warrants methodological innovation in health technology assessment (HTA). She is developing a research line on HTA methods in personalised prevention that includes going beyond efficiency to include the assessment of additional value criteria such as equity in healthcare policy decisions. Uncertainty is a key problem in the assessment of the efficiency and equity of prevention measures and Sabine continues to develop uncertainty assessment methods such as value of information, implementation and heterogeneity.

REPORTING STANDARDS FOR VALUE OF INFORMATION (VOI) ANALYSIS

It was about time! Finally, reporting standards are available for value of information (VOI) analysis. A group of researchers including Dr. Sabine Grimm reviewed CHEERS 2022 in the context of VOI analyses, included 20 of the original CHEERS checklist items, adapted eight existing items and included six new items specific to VOI. It is particularly noteworthy that one of the new items ('Evidence base') recommends the discussion and handling of potential risk of bias and heterogeneity. See for yourself!

SALZBURG MAASTRICHT UNIVERSITY SEMINAR IN ECONOMIC EVALUATION IN HEALTHCARE

The Care and Public Health Research Institute (CAPHRI), the Association of Schools of Public Health in the European Region (ASPHER) and The Open Medical Institute (OMI)







have joined forces to build a new Public Health Academy. Within this partnership, several courses are offered to CAPHRI PhD candidates. From Sunday, November 24 to Saturday, November 30, 2024 the course 'Economic Evaluation in Healthcare' will take place.

Outline course: This is a one-week course for healthcare researchers and healthcare professionals who want to understand the basics of economic evaluation and its application to health technology assessment and decision-making. Economic evaluation tools are largely accepted as indispensable instruments in the evaluation of healthcare goods, services, policy and system reforms. These tools are of critical importance in decision-making for developing evidence-informed policies pertaining to all aspects of resource allocation. Such tools provide insights on how to improve efficiency and how to protect the quality and equity of both healthcare financing and provision.

Course leaders: Silvia Evers, Professor of Public Health Technology Assessment at Maastricht University & Milena Pavlova, Professor of Health Economics and Equity at Maastricht University.

Location: The course will take place at the Open Medical Institute, Schloss Arenberg, Salzburg, Austria. The course is open to 8 CAPHRI PhD candidates (first come, first serve).
