Formats

→ Face-to-face workshops

on any or a combination of the topics listed:

1-3 day introduction workshops focusing on demonstration and topic overview (show/know).

4-5 day advanced workshops with more active participation & co-creation elements (do/co-create).

Blended courses

Face-to-face training sessions combined with distance based assignments and online coaching over a 3-12 month period.

One-off consultancy projects

Review and/or co-creation and/or implementation of specific topic.

Collaboration projects

Tailored collaboration projects for a longer period of time for capacity building of staff and/or to achieve educational and organisational change.

Examples

Introduction student-centred learning

This workshop combines innovative research and technologies with diverse, interdisciplinary expertise to tackle future healthcare challenges. Student-centred education is central, aiming to cultivate patient-focused healthcare professionals. An example of this is Problem Based Learning (PBL).

Anyone that is interested in transitioning or improving their educational approach from a teacher-centered model to one that prioritizes student engagement, particulary through methodologies like PBL, can benefit from this programme.

This workshop can be in a 1, 2 or 3-day session.

Enabling learning

The rationale of our Enabling Learning programme is that teachers (trainers, educators, or facilitators) have the responsibility of helping others acquire knowledge and skills that they will apply in their professional lives. Being a good teacher - facilitating other people to learn - is a skill that one can learn. These courses are especially relevant for clinicians, health care providers and academic staff engaged in student education and training.

This programme is offered in a short course or blended format or as part of a project collaboration.

As an example, the blended course provides a combination of face-to-face sessions conducive to experiential learning, complemented by online education, and supported by the facilitation of the practical application of knowledge within your own context.

The course commences with a 3-day face-to-face session and concludes with another 3-day face-to-face session, culminating in a graduation ceremony. Throughout the programme, participants engage in distance learning at their own pace. The total duration of the course spans from 6 to 9 months.

One-off consultancy projects

Dubai Medical School for Girls, United Arab Emirates

A new Programmatic Assessment Plan

Dubai Medical College for Girls (DMCG) has transitioned to a competency-based curriculum, incorporating a comprehensive assessment plan for the clinical years. Our consultancy services played a crucial role in developing this plan by effectively utilizing existing resources and the new Student Information System. The project commenced with a preparatory phase followed by a 3-day kick-off workshop in Dubai. This was supplemented with ongoing online support and culminated in a final 3-day workshop. The result was a comprehensive assessment plan and a strategic execution strategy, ensuring alignment with the new curriculum and contributing to a successful implementation (2023).



Collaboration projects

Towards student-centred medical education at UNIFACISA, Brazil

In 2021, SHE Collaborates started a long-term project with the university Unifacisa in Brazil. Unifacisa is a private university located in Paraíba state and has started its work in 1999. The university offers degree programs in the field of humanity, technology, and health. Since 2006, the university started a 12-semester medical programme. The medical faculty of Unifasica now wants to move toward more innovative education. UM experts guide the faculty using a step-by-step approach through a redesign of their 6-year medical curriculum towards an integrated, spiral curriculum. By building capacity among the staff of Unifasica, they become enabled to develop and implement a student-centred programme. The project is divided into a preparation phase (year 1-3) and an implementation phase (year 4-7). Each year tailor-made workshops are given and an evaluation is conducted to continue the development of content for the upcoming years.
